Universal Credit Help File for Claimants

Universal Credit replaces the following in-and-out of work benefits for working-age applicants:

- Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- Housing Benefit
- Working Tax Credit
- Child Tax Credit
- Employment and Support Allowance
- Income Support

Please Note:

- You don't need an email address for Universal Credit but you do for Job Seeker's Allowance (JSA).
- It should take 20 40 minutes to complete the application if you have the correct information to hand.
- Library staff CAN:
 - o Point claimants towards helpful resources (resources are over the page).
- Library staff CANNOT:
 - Handle eligibility documents or complete applications for claimants.
 - o Help or advise claimants on how to complete their claims.




Universal Credit went live for new St. Helens claimants in 2014.

There are 4 steps to making a claim:

- 1. Claimants complete the form
- 2. Claimants are invited to a meeting with the relevant authority to go through the detail on the claim form.
- 3. A decision will be made in light of the meeting's outcome.
- 4. Payments are made monthly in arrears, the 1st payment will arrive 1 month and 7 days after the decision is made


If there is any change in your circumstances, claimants must inform the Department for Work and Pensions

When completing the form please note: The browser's **'back-button' should not be used** (or you will lose data already entered).



However the back button contained within the claim form itself can be used.





Once you have started completing the form it will time-out after 20 minutes of inactivity on the website
